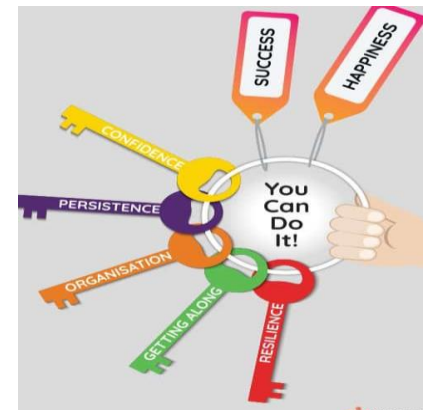

Year Group Organisation

The Year One classrooms are situated to the left-hand side of the main school office. Each classroom has a named door to identify where your child will enter and then leave at the end of the school day. Year One staff will always be present at the door each morning to welcome the children and will be around at the end of the day too.

In Year One, our PE day will be:

- **1AF** – Tuesday
- **1HP** – Tuesday

On a **Wednesday**, your child will either be taking part in a Football and Fitness session or Forest School so they must attend school wearing their PE kit on that day (appropriate to the weather). Please can you also ensure that your child has a pair of named wellington boots in school at all times. Thank you!

Curriculum Overview

During the Autumn Term, the children will be making their transition into Key Stage One through approaching the curriculum with a combination of exploratory and focused, independent activities.

As the year progresses, the children will actively take part in daily Writing, Maths, Phonics and Reading (VIPERS) sessions. Throughout the year, our topics will be 'Discovery Island', 'Great Fire of London' and 'Local Nature Study', which will incorporate a wide range of curriculum areas.

Discovery Island (Autumn Term) – Geography, History, Science, Music and D&T

Great Fire of London (Spring Term) – History, Art, Geography, D&T and Music

Local Nature Study (Summer Term) – Science, Geography, Art, Music and D&T

Alongside our core subjects, the children will also take part in regular sessions of Religious Education (RE), Jigsaw, Computing and Philosophy for Children (P4C).

- Know which is N, S, E and W on a compass.

English



For the Autumn Term, the children shall be focusing on establishing their fundamental skills in order to develop as successful writers. In a creative manner, the children will write for different purposes whilst enhancing their pencil grip, posture, handwriting (letter formations) and letter spacing.

The children will have the opportunity to write lists, labels, captions and accurately punctuated sentences, as part of our role working as a team of special agents for a secret 'heroes' headquarters. As the term progresses and we begin our 'Discovery Island' topic, the children will be focusing on their story telling skills, as well as producing character descriptions using exciting vocabulary choices.

In addition to this, the children will be receiving daily Phonics sessions with Fred the frog, which will support their knowledge of sounds, as well as their skills in blending and segmenting.





Reading

At Sherrier, the expectation is that all children will read at home **at least three times** every week. On each occasion, the parent or child (if they are in Key Stage 2) must:

- Record the date and name of the text
- Note down how much text has been read
- Comment on the reading taking place
- Initial the comment
- Log the running total of reading nights

In school, there will be continuous monitoring of how often each child has read at home and awards (certificates and stickers) will be handed out to those children reaching set milestones. Children will also receive their 'star' on the whole class reading chart displayed within each classroom. Please can you ensure that your child has their reading book/ reading log with them in school on a daily basis. Thank you!

Homework

In Year One, homework tasks will all focus on core learning skills. The tasks will gradually be introduced to the children throughout the Autumn Term.

Reading – All children will be expected to read at home at least three times a week, which must be recorded within their home reading journals (Kluwell booklets).

Phonics – There will be weekly set activities placed on Class Dojo for each child to complete. These will reinforce the sounds that the children are learning at school, as well as focusing on practising the skills of blending and segmenting.

Spellings – Each week, the children will be given a list of spellings to learn that are based on either their prior knowledge or the Year One common exception words.

Maths – This will be a computer based activity using the program NumBots (December).

Class Dojo

Class Dojo has improved the way we communicate and update you on the activities your child is doing in school. It is also used for the following; dates for your diary, sending your child's school reports and dinner menu changes. We will also use it to update you on your child's achievements/behaviour where you will receive a notification on your Dojo App.

Using the message feature:

Class Dojo messages will be received by teachers between the hours of 8.30am - 6pm. You **may** receive a response for these messages during these hours; however, please do not expect a response immediately as it's not always feasible to reply. If your message is urgent then please contact the school office.



Rewards and Sanctions

Rewards

Merits – Given to children for their own learning, recorded on Dojo under merit section. Every 20 gets a certificate.

Team Points - Given to children matching the keys to success etc. Recorded on Dojo and goes towards house team points (Mica, Topaz, Emerald and Sapphire).

GEM Award - Going the Extra Mile – A special visit to Miss Beckett to receive a certificate and a prize!

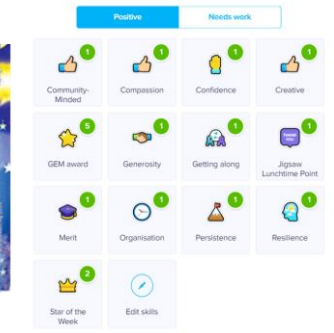
Star of the Week - Every Friday a member of each class will be awarded a Star of the Week certificate and receive this in a special assembly.
