# John Wycliffe translated Bible into English so more people could read








Edward Sherrier bequeathed £200 set up a school at 'church gates' for 5 boys were poor

80-90 boys attending the School A green coat, waisicoat and hat were first issued as school uniform



# Sir Frank Whittle- invented the jet













